Bird Conservation Award criteria

This award will go to the individual who has shown unparalleled accomplishments in bird conservation at the national and international scale as contained in the principles of the North American Bird Conservation Initiative and the national/international bird initiatives (North American Waterfowl Management Plan, Partners in Flight, Waterbird Conservation for the Americas, National Shorebird Plans, and the resident game bird plans). These accomplishments should include their efforts to fulfill the vision of protecting and restoring the populations and habitats of North American birds by:

1. Initiating and broadening bird conservation partnerships.
2. Increasing financial resources available for bird conservation in the U.S. and wherever these species may occur during their life cycles.
3. Enhancing the effectiveness of those resources and partnerships by facilitating integrated bird management.
4. Facilitating integrated bird management through monitoring, research, modeling or habitat conservation work.
5. Facilitating conservation through communication, education, and outreach.

Nominations should include the candidate’s name, title, and member U.S. or Mexican state or Canadian province. Also included should be the name and title of the person making the nomination. **Nomination Deadline is 12/31/08.**
